MEMO:

WTCA Global Town Hall Recap: COVID-19 in APAC

On March 18 and 19, the WTCA hosted two global town hall meetings via teleconference to bring together Members from around the world to discuss the current COVID-19 pandemic, exchange strategies for business continuity, and share perspectives and major concerns. During these virtual roundtables, there was a common, overarching theme: the value and strength of the WTCA network as a resource for local businesses to overcome this crisis. With more than 70 WTC colleagues participating around the world, the global town halls provided a platform for Members to share updates from their local communities and learn from each other.

A few participating Members in Asia — including WTC Beijing, WTC Bengaluru, WTC Harbin, WTC Mumbai, WTC Quanzhou, and WTC Shenyang — were especially helpful in sharing learnings and updates based on their regions' experiences tackling and now emerging from the crisis. The below recap outlines some of those learnings and updates from the Asia Pacific (APAC) region.

THE FIRST REGION IN CRISIS

The APAC region has been in crisis management mode since China decided to lock down the city of Wuhan on January 23, the most populous city in Central China where the COVID-19 outbreak was first reported. As the virus began to spread throughout the region, government officials and health authorities were

forced to take strict measures to curb the outbreak by limiting movement and enforcing social distancing in the local communities. In some of the hard-hit areas, such as many cities throughout China, offices became empty, shopping malls became deserted, restaurants shut down, and hotels either closed or dropped occupancy to single-digit percentages. Major trade shows and events in the APAC region were either canceled or postponed, including the WTCA's General Assembly in Taipei.

To sustain operations, many WTCs in the region had to adjust to working remotely, prioritizing the safety of their staff, tenants, customers and members, while complying with regulations and mandates enforced by their respective national governments.

NETWORK IN ACTION

Despite many challenges, the WTCs throughout the APAC region were able to bolster their services and efforts to help local business communities. By delivering critical information, maintaining communication and establishing connections, they provided support during a time when companies dealt with disruptions to their supply chains, as well as changing rules and regulations for cross-border shipments and travel. For example, WTC Beijing tapped its [e-show global platform](#) to display its members' products and promote trade, while WTC Mumbai accelerated the digital distribution of trade information

and consultation services. Both WTCs identified the importance of technology to continue with their services and programs.

Although countries throughout the region vary significantly in terms of the level and stage of the pandemic, some countries appear to be in transition back to normalcy. For example, China has reported few to zero domestic cases in the past few weeks and manufacturing activities have been recovered to 70-80%. Offices were also re-opened with reduced social distancing restriction.

In response to urgent requests from WTCs throughout the APAC region, the WTCA took swift action at the end of January to create the COVID-19 section in the [WTCA Resource Center](#) (in a folder titled “0. COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Information”) to exchange information and establish matchmaking efforts to deal with shortages of medical supplies. WTCs from around the world reached out to help by sharing relevant information from their business members. As the pandemic spread to Europe and North America, WTCs in the APAC region such as WTC Beijing, WTC Chongqing, WTC Macau, WTC Metro Manila, WTC Quanzhou, WTC Shenyang, and WTC Xi’an have reciprocated the assistance by uploading a great amount of medical supplier information. To date, the WTCA Resource Center features a number of resources

that are updated on a daily basis, including a list of medical suppliers around the world, a list of business continuity resources, a list of helpful weblinks (medical information and travel

advisories), and key messaging for WTCA Members for media inquiries surrounding COVID-19. The WTCA has also launched an external-facing “[COVID-19 Resources and Updates](#)” webpage on the WTCA website that provides local updates from WTCs, and virtual programming offered by WTCA Members (which are open to the public).

THE WTCA’S UNIQUE ROLE

Following these two global town hall meetings, WTCA Members have provided feedback echoing that this is a critical time for the WTCA to step up, demonstrate the power of our network, and leverage our vast connections with business communities around the globe. Together, we’ll be able to play a significant role to help communities combat the pandemic, restore services, and rebuild local economies. As John E. Drew, Chairman, WTCA Board of Directors, stated: “Our mission has always been about ‘connecting the business world,’ and today, that mission is more relevant than ever before... I am confident of the strength in our Association’s collaboration and know we will come out of this stronger than ever.”

WTCA Members Celebrate International Women's Day Around the World

As we mentioned in our [March issue](#), International Women's Day was held on March 8 and our Member WTCs hosted and/or participated in various events around the world to raise awareness for this global day. Below are highlights from some of the events that took place:

WTC BENGALURU

On March 7, WTC Bengaluru hosted a "Talk on Generation of Equality" at the Brigade Gateway campus. Multiple activities were held including a "Spotlight on the Stars" roundtable where each female colleague could share her story, a fashion show to recognize each woman, and a "Mirror on the Wall" discussion where peers shared the qualities they admire in each of their female colleagues. A special

lunch was hosted by Mr. Vineet Verma, President of WTC Bengaluru, where he addressed attendees along with Dr. Bose Nair, Vice President of WTC Bengaluru. During the conversation, it was agreed upon by team members that women's rights require the support of both men and women, and the team made a commitment to support this cause.

With the objective to create an understanding amongst the youth about the recent transformations in society that

Additionally, on March 7, the Women Entrepreneurs Forum organized a session on how to balance your balance sheet, aiming to increase the financial literacy of women in the field of business, and garnered 23 participants who were all women.

These workshops were created for new businesses that are not familiar with the concept of a public tender. To assist these new businesses further, DZTenders worked on a pro bono basis for 12 months to help more than 1,500 newly created SMEs and 3,000 architects acquire bidding for public contracts, resulting in an impressive 50% success rate.
