As such, we have compiled this **Know Before You Go** as a handy guide. Before you arrive at the GBF, please take few minutes to review the important information listed.

About Bengaluru, India

Bengaluru, nestled in southern India's Karnataka state, is renowned for its vibrant tech scene and lush gardens, offering visitors a harmonious blend of contemporary urban culture and serene green spaces, perfect for both business and leisure.

Culture & Customs

India, with its rich diversity, is home to over 100 languages across various communities. At the national level, Hindi and English are recognized, with Hindi being the most widely spoken language. English is also extensively used for official and administrative purposes.

Travelers are encouraged to respect local customs and religious practices; this includes abstaining from beef in many areas and removing shoes before entering places of worship. Bengaluru's dress code is generally more relaxed and Western attire is widely accepted, though modesty is appreciated especially in rural areas and places of worship.

Politics

India is a Sovereign, Socialist, Secular Democratic Republic with a Parliamentary form of government that is federal in structure with unitary features.

India has a multi-party system. The current Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, was elected in 2014 and re-elected in 2019.

Local Dishes

Indian cuisine is vibrant and rich, offering a plethora of flavors with dishes like Biryani, Dosa, Chaat, Butter Chicken, Palak Paneer, and the beloved Naan. When you visit India, immersing yourself in the local food scene is a must.

Eating with your hands is part of the traditional experience, especially when enjoying meals like Roti or Rice with curry.



Please be aware that the food can be quite spicy, so it's advisable to proceed with caution if you're not accustomed to heat in your dishes. When exploring street food, prioritize stalls that attract a lot of customers and maintain high hygiene standards.

Right Hand Rule

In India, it is customary to use your right hand for eating, greeting, and giving or receiving items. Cultural traditions dictate that the left hand is typically used for hygiene purposes and is therefore considered impure for other uses. To adhere to local etiquette, ensure that you use your right hand for these activities, as using the left hand might be perceived as disrespectful in social and dining contexts.

Bottled Water

In India, it is advised that travelers do not consume tap water directly due to concerns about contamination and waterborne diseases. Play it safe and stick to bottled water when:

- Brushing your teeth
- At a restaurant
- At your hotel

Understanding Bargaining

In local markets, learn to bargain effectively:

- Know the value of the item
- Make your initial offer lower than what you are willing to pay
- Maintain a friendly demeanor
- Use the Walk Away Technique: Express disinterest and start to walk away. Often, this can lead to the seller calling you back and offering a lower price
- If you are buying multiple items, you can often get a better deal.

Greeting Others

Do Not Point with your index finger

Greet with a nod or a small bow with hands pressed together, saying "Namaste." It's a sign of respect and is widely appreciated.

Pointing with your index finger can be considered impolite or rude, especially when directed at people. It can be seen as a harsh gesture.





In March, Bengaluru typically experiences very high temperatures and low rainfall. Anticipate daytime temperatures around 34°C, while night temperatures can drop to 21°C. Travel Precautions

When visiting India, prioritizing your health and safety is essential. The country offers a rich tapestry of cultural experiences and natural beauty, but it's important to stay vigilant against health risks such as waterborne diseases and seasonal flu. Take appropriate measures to ensure a healthy trip. India is generally welcoming to tourists, but, like any popular destination, it has its share of safety concerns. To enjoy your visit while minimizing risks, consider the following advice:

- Carry only the necessary amount of cash and use a digital payment option where available. Look for rickshaws that agree to use the meter.
- This helps avoid haggling over the fare and ensures you pay a fair price based on the distance traveled. If a meter option is not available, be sure to agree on a price before getting in.
- Exercise caution when using public transportation, opting for reputable services or app-based cabs such as Ola or Uber. It is recommended you contact the front desk of your hotel to arrange car service transport.
- Bengaluru's streets are crowded, keep an eye out when crossing.
- Stay alert in crowded places to avoid pickpockets, and familiarize yourself with common scams targeting travelers.
- Consider travel insurance. If you get ill or injured, medical treatment you require can be covered by your insurance and reimbursed. Some insurance policies will also cover you for theft, lost luggage, and cancellations.

Currency and Exchange

In Bengaluru, the local currency is the Indian Rupee (INR). Banks, authorized dealers, and airport kiosks are readily available for currency exchange. Carrying less cash and leaning towards secure transaction methods like cards are recommended for safety and convenience.

Debit and credit cards are widely accepted across hotels, restaurants, and shops, with ATMs across the city providing easy access to cash. Additionally, QR code payments are becoming popular, supported by UPI-enabled apps such as Google Pay, Paytm, and PhonePe, offering a fast and contactless payment option.

Before you arrive in India, please be sure to check the current conversion rate between your country and India to get an updated estimate on costs.



TRAVELING TO INDIA Helpful Tips



Obtain required vaccines* as advised by your doctor before traveling to India.



Apply for a visa to India **ASAP** before you travel.



Carry hand sanitizer and towelettes with you when you leave the hotel property as they are not typically in public washrooms.



Carry copies of your passport.



Be prepared for the heat and humidity. Wear light, breathable clothing and sunscreen.



Do not be afraid to ask for help.



Don't take photos of people without their permission.



While you may bargain while shopping, don't bargain too aggressively.



Don't haggle with taxi drivers.



Don't drink the tap wate as it is not safe to drink. Be sure to drink boiled water or bottled water instead. GBF host hotels provide bottled water to guests.
